#### ARTWalk Selects Performers for Free September Arts Festival

ROCHESTER, NY - ARTWalk is pleased to formally announce the selected performers and artists for the fifth annual "ARTWalk Alive! festival to be held Sunday, September 18 from noon to 4 pm along the 700 block of University Avenue. These groups and individuals were jury selected from an annual area wide open call for performers.

The "Dances on the Avenue" portion of the program includes dance works performed outdoors along ARTWalk. The selected "Dances on the Avenue" performers are: Pywakkit, Waldman Sisters, Sahara Shimmer, Flux Fusion, Motoniks, Capoeira Mandinga, Rochester Step-off, and Bush Mango Drum & Dance

At 2 pm, Congresswoman Louise Slaughter will officially announce \$1.6 million in federal transportation dollars to extend the ARTWalk trail. The selected artists responded to an open call for the event sponsored by ARTWalk. The audience walks or dances, led by dancing docents, from stage to stage to enjoy the performances.
